### Key Features of Social Sciences Citation Index (SSCI)

In addition to its function as an index to journal literature, SSCI can be used to discover relationships between journal articles through their cited references.

1. For example, let's say you have a bibliography with the following articles. A valuable feature of SSCI is the Cited Ref Search, which is a tool for discovering research related to your topic by using the research of a particular author.

Stanton, M. (2005). Relapse prevention needs more emphasis on interpersonal factors. *American Psychologist*, 60, 340-341.

2. Searching for the author using the Cited Ref Search will tell you how many times your author has been cited by others. Look carefully at the names of the cited works to make sure that you are selecting your particular author. After you have checked your author's references, click on Finish Search at the top or the bottom of the list.

Your search has found the following references.  
Select only those cited references you want to include,  
then click FINISH SEARCH.  
(Hint: Look for variants. Papers are sometimes cited incorrectly.)

3. The articles that you retrieve from the Cited Ref Search can be helpful because you will be able to see how others have used your author's research since your author's articles were published.
