UNRS 410	Community Health Nursing (2/4) – Primary Clinical Course in BSN for PHN Certificate Students in this course are required to be a part of the lectures for: GLBL 355 Principles and Practices of Community Engagement - This exciting new course provides a "Jesus model" for community building. The course will guide your four-week long field work and service experience and help you integrate your major/career plans with global and local issues/needs.	6
UNRS 425	Nursing Research (ONLINE) – Required Core Course	3
UNRS 496	Issues & Ethics in Nursing – Required Capstone course – Senior Seminar	4
HIST 335	Culture and History of South Africa – (General Studies Elective) This course provides an overview of South African History, literature, Culture, and Contemporary Social Issue. It will be taught while you are traveling and visiting important history and cultural sites.	3

Below are **SAMPLE** dates for the South Africa Semester. If you are accepted to study in South Africa, you will be given a packet containing your semester's detailed itinerary at a Pre-Departure Meeting.

Coursework: COMM310 ("Intercultural Communication"), one Introductory Zulu lecture per week for all students and HIST335 field trips Coursework (elective): Two courses from among the General Studies courses offered, or 8 units of IsiZulu 101/102 (IsiZulu to continue through 10 weeks) Coursework for nursing students: UNRS496 and UNRS425 plus UNRS410 ("Community Health"), which includes clinical practice (to continue through 10 weeks).

Information about Nursing & South Africa Study Abroad

Have you heard about the Study Abroad experience for Nursing students in South Africa?

This exciting nursing program will be offered to Seniors taking UNRS 410 (Community Health Nursing) and will be a part of the existing APU South Africa Study Abroad program. The vision of this study abroad program is that nursing students will develop an awareness of cross-cultural values and perspectives, and integrate a global vision into their life and practice as nurses, as well as in their future career and ministry plans. This is a service-directed program; nursing students will participate in a variety of service-learning projects in neighboring communities, including HIV/AIDS health programs, orphanages, local NGOs, health clinics, schools, and other community development organizations. Attached you will find an application to be considered for the Study Abroad opportunity. Please turn it in as quickly as possible.

"But I can always travel after graduation."

This is a semester long, nursing-integrated study abroad program! When else will you get to spend four months learning from both APU and South African professors in an international setting? You will have the opportunity to reflect and discuss what you are learning with your peers and faculty, rather than being alone on this journey. There are also numerous travel excursions around South Africa planned during the semester! Excursion sites include: Johannesburg, Cape Town, the beach, Nelson Mandela's home and jail cell, Table Mountain, a game reserve, and many other places!

"I don't want to be off campus during my Senior year."

The South Africa program is one of a few APU-sponsored programs around the world. This means that the South Africa program is considered an APU campus, so seniors can participate! As part of the program's staff, there are two student-life coordinators who plan fun events and community building activities for the group. You will get the chance to interact with over 40 APU students from different majors. Nursing students will be living, traveling, and taking some of the same classes with the entire group. Students who have been to South Africa say that the community they experienced with each other was one of their favorite parts of the whole program. Take time to talk with one of them!

"I can't afford it."

Tuition is the same as for the Azusa campus, and most student scholarships, grants, and other federal financial aid may still be used for payment. Everything, including the flight, is included in the tuition! Other than housing for the two week pre-trip module for some UNRS 410 clinical hours before you leave, the room and board includes all meals during the entire semester, as well as all the accommodations during travel, home stays, and excursions. Think of all the gas money you'll save!

"My parents are worried about safety."

Your safety is one of our main concerns. We will do everything possible to make you aware of the risks and appropriate precautions at all sites. All students will be registered with the U.S. Consulate. Our pre-departure sessions will also cover travel and safety tips. Precautions are taken to ensure that students, especially females, will always be in a group.
