PTL for the city we love — "The hardest experience is to see people who look like you suffer. Although they were living in some of the worst situations, they still saw God as being faithful to them. There were days when they questioned why they were in the positions that they were but for the most part they were happy for the simple things. I have learned that your environment does not dictate your future. Camden, New Jersey is redeeming itself from the oppressive grasp of the world. It is working within itself to find its worth and value. The old cobblestone streets in North Camden are filled with stories of triumph and tragedy. The waterfront contains dreams of exceeding beyond the city's limitations. The roads are filled with pain, sorrow, struggle, and oppression, but these are washed away each time a fire hydrant is opened on a hot and humid day and children find joy as they dance in its refreshment, escaping the reality of their situation for a few hours. This is the city we love. We carry it with us wherever we go, but not because we cannot let go. We carry it with us for one reason and one reason alone: now that we have seen, we are responsible."



China: June 28 - Aug. 11 PTL sacrifice - "Today after my students gave their final speeches, as this was their oral exam, I had a little speech of my own. I have seen them overflowing with generosity and love to the point that I think it will change how I live for the rest of my life. The few students who have part-time jobs make about \$0.74 an hour. Upon my prompting, a girl told me today that the reason she is working during her summer break is to buy her dad a wallet for his birthday. This sacrificial love is undeniably admirable but even more it humbles me. Too much of my focus is on myself and not on others. Today my Korean neighbor bought me a coffee when he saw me at dinner. One of Brandon's students bought all six of us treats at the market, never met her. It may be easier to sacrifice for someone you love, but for a guest or a stranger? If I say I love Him who I cannot see, I must love my brother who I can see. I've been contemplating the meaning of the passage in Matthew 26:6-10. This is the story of the woman who

poured her expensive perfume on Jesus so that she could worship Him. How much do I save so that I can sacrifice for the Lord and His purposes? Our students have been incredibly gracious to us. It has truly been a joy to serve here this summer and help them improve their English. In our next week on campus we'll be doing some more one-on-one time with the students remaining in the area and we pray that lives will still be changed as the Holy Spirit opens their eyes and fills their hearts."

Haiti August, School of Nursing: August 1 - August 20
