THE CHASE A. SAWTELL INSPIRATIONAL FACULTY AWARD and THE TEACHING EXCELLENCE AND CAMPUS LEADERSHIP AWARD

DESCRIPTION

Each year, Azusa Pacific University presents an award to each of two worthy faculty members. They are The Chase A. Sawtell Inspirational Faculty Award and The Teaching Excellence and Campus Leadership Award, which were funded for two years initially by the Sears Roebuck Foundation. These awards are presented at the Fall Faculty Workshop and each is accompanied by a memento and an honorarium of \$1,000.

CRITERIA FOR THE CHASE A. SAWTELL INSPIRATIONAL FACULTY AWARD

The recipient shall be a full-time APU faculty member with a minimum of two full-time years of service at APU; shall model significant faculty involvement in the lives of students; shall have a strong Christian influence in the lives of students, peers, alumni, and administrative staff; and shall be seen as living a life of service to others, affirming the worth of each person as a unique individual created by God. Past recipients are not eligible for five years after receiving the award.

CRITERIA FOR THE TEACHING EXCELLENCE AND CAMPUS LEADERSHIP AWARD

The recipient shall be a faculty member who has made a distinct difference in the teaching climate of the university in such areas as model classroom teaching, campus leadership, pioneering teaching methodology, creative course development and/or instructional support. Past recipients are not eligible for five years after receiving the award.
