



OUTDOOR ADVENTURES INTERNS

Objective: To coordinate all aspects of outdoor recreational programming for the APU community, as well as maintain and promote all Communiversality recreational equipment rental program.

Internship Expectations:

- Christian commitment: You are expected to integrate your faith into your role as a Communiversality intern.
- You must have the desire to serve this campus by utilizing your position and creating opportunities for others to get connected to the APU community.
- Participate in Fall training (approximately two and a half weeks before the start of school)
- Participate in Spring staff retreat (first weekend after school starts)
- Work together with other interns to implement Communiversality events.
- Work 5 hours a week in the Office of Communiversality.
- Meet weekly with either the Communiversality Professional Staff and or the graduate assistants.
- Attend weekly Communiversality staff meetings.
- Work with the Communiversality Professional Staff, the graduate assistants, and the administrative assistant in the implementation and the organization of all contracts, correspondence, budget, and financial paperwork.
- Other duties as assigned by the Communiversality Professional Staff or the graduate assistants.

Fall Semester

- Participate in ongoing outdoor leadership guide training program
- Coordinate 1 overnight trip
- Coordinate 3 day trips (one must be free for all participants)

Spring Semester

- Coordinate 1 overnight trip
- Coordinate 3 day trips (one must be free for all participants)
- Create an ongoing outdoor leadership training program

Either Fall Semester or Spring Semester

- Collaborate with the High Sierra Program and coordinate a recruitment trip to the High Sierra campus
- Research other institutions regarding their outdoor adventure/recreational programs

Other Programming Expectations:

- collaborate with other offices
- proactively seek ways to create opportunities for commuters
- Proactively seek feed back from under represented groups on campus (i.e. MEP, ISS, etc.)
- Plan, develop, and distribute all promotion, publicity, and advertisement for Outdoor Adventure events, in conjunction with other Communiversality interns.
- Create, select, and chair the outdoor leadership group for the purpose of training outdoor adventure leader throughout the year, and the future Communiversality recruitment.
