Complete Freshman Writing Seminar Two semesters of the same foreign language College Algebra level completed

Prerequisites

If a class has a prerequisite, it will appear in the Undergraduate Catalog under the course number. Scheduling sequence (ask the department).

Balance of Units and Types of Classes

Try to limit yourself to one 4-unit course per semester.

Transferring Units

If you are planning to take summer courses at a community college, remember to have the classes pre-approved by <u>One Stop</u> before you enroll. Allow 2 weeks for submitted Transfer Inquiry Forms to process.

Seasonally Offered Classes

Please keep in mind that not all classes are offered every semester, so you will need to plan ahead for those. Check with the department that offers the class.
