A couple of summers ago, my mother was a victim of a cranial aneurysm. As the main breadwinner for our family, she not only provided income for my sister and me, but my father as well, whose disability renders him at home for most of the day. Through the grace of God, and the prayers of family and friends, my mom was able to survive her brain surgery and was on the path to full recovery. During her recovery, however, I was put in a position where I didn't know if I could continue to even attend school, let alone pay for it. Having a scholarship has been an immense blessing for my family and me. It lifts a weight that we feared we would have to carry on our own. Because of your generosity, my family doesn't have to choose between

sending me to a Christian educational institute, or paying for medical bills. My scholarship further emphasizes how willing and passionate those around are to see me continue my studies and succeed in the future. It is a reminder that we are never in this journey alone.

I chose APU because I felt able to find my own voice in an institute based on Biblical principles. The faculty and students have a sense of community, and are very eager to interact with each individual. I've learned more about my faith, and also about who I am as a person. Extracurricular activities such as clubs and mission trips test my capabilities and encourage me to succeed.

So far, I would say my mission trip to Cebu, Philippines has impacted me the most. This was my first time ever going on a mission trip, and I really had no idea what it would be like or how it would personally impact me. When I was invited out of the blue to join the mission trip, I accepted because I saw it as an opportunity to be used by God to help further aid whatever work He was already doing. We stayed in Cebu for a couple of weeks, and I became close with many of the people there, including many of my classmates whom I had just met. God showed me that there are places on earth that seem to be in poverty, materialistically speaking. However, the richness comes from the community, love, generosity, and overall joyous spirit of the people around you. Everyone there was so eager to make us feel comfortable and would go out of their way to do so. I cried when it came time to leave, and a couple of weeks after arriving back to the United States, I was still emotional as I shared about the trip. I learned how much I take for granted. Even more importantly, I learned that as someone who has been blessed, it is my job to share that blessing with others.

Ever since I was a child, I loved being a storyteller. I loved to write, draw comics, and make skits and videos with my friends. Although I am studying graphic design, I hope to someday work among movie companies

such as DreamWorks, Universal Studios, or Laika Films. APU's art classes are open-ended and encourage students to think outside the box with our ideas. 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




