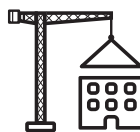

- 14 long-running programs in the city sponsored by APU, including Azusa Reads, Writes, and Counts; 8th-Grade Major Fair; Azusa Conservatory; and Our Neighborhood Wellness Center
- \$140,000 in scholarships each year through the Azusa Scholars program
- \$10,000 annual scholarship and guaranteed admission for qualifying high school graduates from Azusa through a partnership with AUSD
