

# Azusa Pacific University California Economic Impact

With a higher six-year graduation rate than the state average, Azusa Pacific University equips its graduates with a full range of marketable characteristics that increase their employability and earning capacity in the workforce. Based on national wage reports, APU alumni with bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degrees earn more than the rest of the nation's population who hold the same degrees. In key California industries, APU alumni earn significantly more than their peers: \$30,000 more annually in health care; \$28,000 more in education.
