## Frequently Asked Questions

When is the application due?	The application deadline is Wednesday, March 18 <sup>th</sup> .
When should I arrive in Bass Lake?	Please plan to arrive in Bass Lake on Sunday, May 3 <sup>rd</sup> between 3-5pm. Unfortunately, we will not be able to accommodate arrivals earlier than this time.
Can I bring my car?	Yes
If I don't have a car, is there a way that I can get picked up in Fresno?	Yes. We will have a shuttle run on Sunday May 3 <sup>rd</sup> at 4pm from the Fresno airport and train station. If you arrive later than 4pm, we can arrange an additional shuttle for you at the cost of \$30.
What will the class format look like?	The weather in May is typically fantastic in Bass Lake so you might have class in the Emerald Cove meadow, at the lake, or on Star Rock. This will be an academically intense three weeks. Classes will meet daily for 3-4 hours with significant outside-of-class reading each day. All classes will be small, discussion-oriented seminars.
Can I take more than one of the classes being offered?	No. Due to the short 3-week timeframe, the classes will be offered concurrently. Furthermore, this will be an academically intense 3 weeks, and there would not be enough time to complete the out-of-class assignments for more than one course. However, there will be structured interaction between the classes in the form of occasional Plenary sessions.
Will I need any special clothing or gear?	Yes. You will need some specific clothing for the short outdoor trips. Please see the what-to-bring list for more information. We will provide all camping gear (sleeping bags, sleeping pad, backpack, tents, stoves, etc).
How will this be different than a typical semester at High Sierra?	Many elements of the traditional High Sierra Program will be integrated into the Summer Seminars: community meal times, academically challenging classes, and wilderness trips into Yosemite and surrounding areas. However, you can expect a smaller community, more mobile classes, and class 5 days a week. You will also be free to use your car to visit local hangouts and hikes.
What will the weekends look like?	Saturdays will be free for you to work on homework, invest in relationships, and enjoy the natural beauty in and around Bass Lake. Sundays will begin our off-campus adventures.
How much spending money will I need?	This is entirely up to you. You can get away with a minimal amount of spending money for a few coffee shop runs, the occasional meal off-campus, and shopping in Oakhurst as desired. But if you want to spend time thrift-store shopping in Oakhurst or purchasing trinkets in Yosemite, you may want to bring a little more money.
What is the housing situation?	Gender-specific housing will be provided. Rooms are furnished with a regular twin bed, desk, and dresser for each student.
What if I have already taken one of these classes?	Each Humanities course is cross-listed as Philosophy and English respectively. Therefore, if you are a Philosophy or English major or minor, these classes can fulfill other requirements for you. All classes will conclude on Friday, May 22 <sup>nd</sup> and students will depart on Saturday, May 23 <sup>rd</sup> no later than 2pm. <b>Final papers will be submitted via email one week after the end of the term (May 29<sup>th</sup>).</b> <b>Please allot adequate time as you make your post-Summer Seminar plans.</b>

**A. Student Standards of Conduct Policy**

In order to create and maintain a safe and God-honoring environment for all of our study abroad programs, the Center for Global Learning & Engagement (CGLE) will be requesting a complete "discipline clearance" for each undergraduate applicant from: Academic Advising (clearance from academic probation), Residence Life, Student Life, Communiversity, and any other relevant department (at the discretion of the CGLE). Applicants are not officially accepted to the program without this clearance. All participants of an APU administered or endorsed off-campus study program shall be subject to the "Standards of Conduct" policy appearing in the APU Undergraduate Student Handbook, APU Graduate Catalog, or any similar standards set by the particular program. In the case of conflicting standards, the more stringent standard applies. APU reserves the right to deny a student based on their discipline history at APU. If a student discipline issue occurs after acceptance or during the program, the student may be cancelled from the program and will lose any non-refundable monies or pre-payments made on the student's behalf. Because of the possibility of serious effects on group safety and coherence, on-field staff will deal with violations immediately and has discretion to imposing sanctions after investigating and holding a formal or informal hearing. The opportunity for appeal is limited by the nature of the study abroad experience. Additional sanctions may be imposed upon the student's return to campus.

**B. Student Disability and Healthcare Abroad**

The CGLE, is committed to assisting all students in selecting study abroad opportunities that meet their needs, including students with disabilities. Many towns, communities, and institutions abroad are not equipped with wheelchair access or easily accessible for hearing or vision impairments or offer mental health support. Further, some trips require activities that may be strenuous for some participants, including long climbs or hikes. The CGLE in conjunction with APU's Learning Enrichment Center (LEC) will seek to advise students to appropriate study abroad programs for any disability needs. Program directors and the CGLE will do as much as possible to ensure the overall safety of study abroad participants. However, specific or special needs should be researched by the individual participant. The CGLE can assist students with medication translation, healthcare facilities in nearby areas abroad, personal emergency planning, copies of important medical or travel documents (copies of passports, prescriptions, health insurance policies, etc.). If a student participant receives accommodation from the LEC, has been treated for depression, anxiety, eating disorders, or anything else that can be classified as a mental health condition, students should contact the LEC for information in a timely manner at (626) 815-3849 for accommodation information to be deemed reasonable and/or required. Students should also obtain any appropriate insurance coverage for treatment abroad, separate from the global medical insurance provided from Azusa Pacific University if needed.

**E. Graduation Agreements & Studying Abroad Senior Year (Undergraduate Students)**

Seniors are not allowed to Study Abroad their last semester. Any student intending to study abroad their final semester must request APU's General Petition Form from the One Stop Office and submit the completed form to One Stop. Students are responsible to adhere to the Intent to Graduate deadlines listed in the academic calendar. Intent to Graduate forms for May and July are due in mid-November and Intent to Graduate forms for December are due in mid-April. If you have above 90 units, and are studying abroad during these deadlines, you will be sent an email to your APU account from One Stop with a link to an electronic version of the Intent to Graduate Form. It is your responsibility to fill out the form and submit to One Stop by the deadline. Forms submitted late will be subject to a \$200 late fee. Your Academic Specialist will then initiate the graduation clearance process for you. Statement of Responsibility, Release & Authorization to Participate in an Azusa Pacific University Domestic Travel Studies Program.

I have agreed to participate in \_\_\_\_\_ (Program), a domestic travel study enrichment program sponsored or endorsed by the University. I understand and hereby acknowledge that my participation in the Program is wholly voluntary. In consideration of being allowed to participate in the Program, I hereby agree as follows:

**1. Comprehensive Health & Accident Insurance:** I hereby represent and warrant that I am and will be covered throughout the Program by a policy of comprehensive health and accident insurance through Insurance Services of America, which provides coverage for injuries and illnesses I sustain or experience, while traveling on the Program. By my signature below, I certify that my health insurance policy will adequately cover me, and I absolve the University of all responsibility and liability for any injuries (including death), illnesses, claims damages, charges, bills and/or expenses I may incur while participating in this Program. I agree to report to the University any physical or mental condition I have which may require special medical attention or accommodation during the Program at least thirty (30) days prior to departure.

**2. Right to Make Changes:** I understand that the University reserves the right to make changes to the Program itinerary at any time and for any reason, with or without notice, and the University shall not be liable for any loss whatsoever to me by reason of any such cancellation or change. The University is not responsible for penalties assessed by air carriers that may result due to operational and/or itinerary changes, regardless of whether the University makes a flight arrangement. Any additional expense resulting from the above will be paid by me. The University reserves the right to substitute hotels or accommodations or housing of a similar category at any time. Specific room and housing assignments are within the sole discretion of the University.

**3. Responsibility or Liability:** I understand and acknowledge that the University assumes no responsibility or liability, in whole or in part, for any delays, delayed or changed departure or arrival times, fare changes, dishonors of hotel, airline or vehicle rental reservations, missed carrier connections, sickness, disease, injuries (including death), losses, damages, weather, strikes, acts of God, circumstances beyond the control of the University, force majeure, war, quarantine, civil unrest, public health risks, criminal activity, terrorism, expense, accident, injuries, damage to property, bankruptcies of airlines or other service providers, inconveniences, cessation of operations, mechanical defects, failure or negligence of any nature howsoever caused in connection with any accommodations, restaurant, transportation, or other service or for any substitution of hotels or of common carriers beyond the University’s control, with or without notice, or for any additional expense occasioned by any of the foregoing. If due to weather, flight schedules or other uncontrollable factors I am required to spend additional nights, the University will not be responsible for my hotel, transfer meal costs or other expenses. My baggage and personal property are transported at my risk entirely. The right is reserved by the University, in its sole discretion, to cancel the Program or any aspect thereof prior to departure; and, in the University’s sole discretion to cancel the Program or any aspect thereof after departure, requiring that all participants return home if the University determines or believes that any person is or will be in danger if the Program or any aspect thereof is continued.

**4. Right to Decline, to Accept or Retain Me:** The University reserves the right to decline to accept or retain me in the Program at any time should my actions or general behavior impede the operation of the Program or the rights or welfare of any person. Similarly, if my conduct violates any policy or procedure of the University, or any provision of \_\_\_\_\_ (Program &/or host organization), which I hereby agree shall apply to my conduct while participating in the Program, I understand that I may be required to leave the Program in the sole discretion of the University’s employees, agents and representatives and I may be referred to the appropriate Azusa Pacific University officials for further disciplinary action. I understand and

hereby acknowledge that institution(s) I attend or in whose facilities I reside or learn in connection with the Program, if I violate either or both institution's rules, policies or student conduct codes. I hereby consent to the jurisdiction of all such institutions (including Azusa Pacific University), to discipline me, separately or cumulatively, for any instance(s) of misconduct which occur(s) during the Program. I agree not to challenge in any forum or proceeding the authority or jurisdiction of Azusa Pacific University to discipline me at any time for my misconduct, during or in connection with the Program or any travel related thereto.

**5. Field Trips and Elective Travel:** I may elect to participate in field trips and/or personal travel during the Program. I hereby represent and warrant that my participation in these activities is not required by the University and is wholly voluntary. I understand and hereby acknowledge that I may face an increased risk or injury or death due to civil unrest, violence, terrorism, crime or political instability by traveling to or in \_\_\_\_\_ (city and/or state). I hereby assume, knowingly and voluntarily, each of these risks and all of the other risks which could arise out of or occur during my travel to, from, in or around \_\_\_\_\_ (city and/or state).

**6. It is understood that this authorization is given in advance of any specific diagnosis, treatment, or hospital care being rendered, but is given to provide authority and power on the part of the Agent in the event of my disability to give specific consent to any and all such diagnosis, treatment, or hospital care which the above mentioned physician, in the exercise of his/her best judgment, may deem advisable.
