BFA in Acting for the Stage and Screen

The Department of Theater Arts offers a BFA in Acting for the Stage and Screen. The BFA is designed for students who would like to act professionally in theater, film and television. It requires 63 units to graduate.

APU is one of the only Christian universities in the country to offer a BFA that trains students how to act in both theater and film. Our proximity to Los Angeles provides our students with incredible opportunities to bridge the gap between their education and real-world application. Students are taught and directed by professional actors and directors. In the fourth year of training, Seniors act in a web series with professional film and television directors and actors and participate in an industry screening in Los Angeles.

All prospective students must audition prior to entering the degree.




BFA Show Case and Screening
