- Students possessing, distributing, and/or using alcohol, narcotics, or other intoxicants on University premises or at University-sponsored activities will be subject to judicial action. The University acknowledges that biblical teaching, Church history, and data showing the dangers of alcohol abuse provide sound foundations for clear community standards related to alcohol.
