Scholarship Criteria

Entering full-time two year or full-time advanced standing MSW students in the *Clinical Specialization* are eligible to apply. Only prospective students with completed applications and FASFA reports who have been offered acceptance in the MSW program will be considered for the scholarship. Email copies of the application and supporting documentation to Mary Rawlings at mrawlings@apu.edu. Applications must be **complete** and received by: Wednesday, March 15, 2023 at 5 p.m.

Applications must include a one to two page double-spaced essay on interest and commitment to work in a primary care setting (direct practice site) providing behavioral health in medically underserved communities (MUC). This essay should also include a statement on how this scholarship would impact the student's educational experience and completion of the program.


Applicants must meet the following criteria for scholarship consideration, and provide evidence as outlined below:

A. Demonstrated Financial Need

Have demonstrated financial need of \$30,000 or more, as indicated on FASFA report.

B. Defined Disadvantaged Background

Be from a defined disadvantaged background, meeting at least ONE of the following criteria:



student (verified by the Social Work Department through Financial Services reporting), history of poverty, illness, single parent status, history of foster care, history of substance dependence and recovery, or other life circumstance. *If applying under this criteria*, please submit additional narrative (up to one page) describing your environmental disadvantage(s) with your application.

__Educational Disadvantage: Graduation from low performing high school, as determined by California State Department of Education - School Accountability Report Card. (Refer to the Department of Education website.) The student is responsible to research and submit evidence of school's low performance. Submit copy of high school diploma along with printout of the School Accountability Report Card documenting of high school performance rating with application.

C. Qualifying Citizenship/Resident Status

Please verify status as a United States citizen, national, or permanent resident. *Please attach a copy of passport, birth certificate, naturalization certificate, or permanent resident card.*

D. Tax Returns/Evidence of Dependency Status

Please provide copies of Federal Tax Return form 1040 for the past three years. If you are 24 years old or younger <u>OR</u> are listed as a dependent on someone else's return at any time during the past three years, you must also provide copies of parental/guardian family's tax return for the past three years.

Accepted students must sign and agree to the following:

- Intern in a behavioral health care primary care setting serving medically underserved communities in years one and two of the MSW program (one year for advanced standing students)
- Report on training received during internship
- Participate in faculty mentorship activities
- Report need for and use of department and university support services
- Seek employment in medically underserved communities providing behavioral health care in a primary care setting upon graduation
- Provide written statement on impact of SDS award on degree completion and preparation for employment in in a primary care setting providing behavioral health in medically underserved communities (MUC)
- Report employment information to the department annually for four years, as requested
- Apply for and submit evidence of a National Provider Identification number (NPI)

Awards are not to exceed \$30,000 per year (two years for two-year full-time students, and one year for 10-month advanced standing students). Awards are meant as an incentive to support students from disadvantaged backgrounds, with a passion for delivering integrated behavioral health care in medically underserved communities, to attain an MSW degree in preparation of clinical practice. Funds will be distributed each semester after the add/drop deadline, and funding is contingent on successful completion of program requirements, and on continued Federal funding by the *Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) under Scholarships for Disadvantaged Students*.
