APA Headings: The Five Levels

What are APA headings?

APA headings are used as an organizational tool in your paper or study, and they establish a hierarchy of sections via format or appearance. Headings help to effectively organize ideas within a paper or study.

Why do I need to use headings in my paper?

Headings help make planning a less complicated process for the writer. More concise headings help the reader anticipate key points and track the development of your argument.

Getting Started: The different levels of headings should correspond to specific sections of your paper.

Format for the Five Levels of Heading in APA	
Level of Heading Format	
1	Centered, Boldface, Uppercase
	and Lowercase Heading
2	Flush Left, Boldface, Uppercase and
	Lowercase Heading
3	Indented, boldface, lowercase paragraph heading ending with a period.
4	Indented, boldface, italicized, lowercase paragraph heading ending with a period.
5	Indented, italicized, lowercase paragraph heading ending with a period.

Note: Like in an outline, there must be at least two subsections in the same level. So if you have a heading like this (see below), there must be at least two of them.
