Azusa Pacific University - University College (UC) takes very seriously complaints and concerns regarding the institution.

If you believe that your complaint warrants further attention after you have exhausted all the steps and appeals outlined by the Grievance Policy, you may present your complaint to the WASC Senior College and University Commission (WSCUC) at www.wscuc.org/comments if your complaint is associated with the institution’s compliance with academic program quality and accrediting standards. WSCUC is the agency that accredits Azusa Pacific University’s academic programs.

If you believe that your complaint continues to warrant further consideration after exhausting the review of either WSCUC or administrators at Azusa Pacific University – University College, you may contact the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education for review of a complaint.
